#### FOREWORD

Bhattadev University was established under the Bhattadev University Act, 2017 on 24 June 2019, the date on which the undersigned, following his appointment by the then Honourable Governor of Assam, Prof. Jagdish Mukhi, joined the institution as the first Vice-Chancellor of the University. The University started functioning from the existing 14-acre campus of Bajali College, the NAAC 'A' Grade college which was upgraded to the state university under Assam Act No. XXXVI of 2017 to which the Honourable Governor of Assam gave his consent on 16<sup>th</sup> October, 2017. The institution had already been running 18 undergraduate (UG) and 4 postgraduate (PG) programmes under Gauhati University to which it was affiliated. Following its establishment, the institution started taking baby steps to become a University by following its own UG and PG syllabuses, and also by conducting its own examinations. The First Statutes, Ordinances and Regulations of the University were drafted within a short time, and the same – being approved by a six-member committee appointed by the Honourable Chancellor for the purpose – were submitted to the Chancellor's office in October 2019. Since authorities of the University, i.e. Court, the Executive Council and the Academic Council were yet to be constituted, discussions regarding university matters were held among all teachers or among all Heads of Academic Departments and the university affairs were run by the undersigned with the help of a group of teachers who were given various additional charges in addition to their teaching during the period under review.

In view of the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic throughout the year under review, many of the activities had to be run in the online mode, as far as possible. The undersigned and officers-in-charge came to the campus whenever permissible under the situation and measures to contain the spread of the pandemic were taken to the possible extent. Academic activities of the University continued in spite difficulties in holding classes and examinations in the online mode. In spite of the obvious hardships, it was possible to keep the academic progression of the students unaffected. However, developmental works in the campus had nearly come to a standstill in view of the difficulties caused by the raging pandemic.

This report encompasses all relevant academic and administrative information of this university for the period 1 April 2020 to 31 March 2021. The format used for preparing this report is largely based on the format used by Gauhati University for the same purpose. The undersigned acknowledges the help received from several faculty and staff members in addition to the committee specifically appointed for preparing Annual Reports in completing this report. It is hoped that it will give a comprehensive overview of the activities and performance of the University during the period under review.

#### A profile Bhattadev University, Bajali

On 24<sup>th</sup> of June, 2019, Bhattadev University came into existence by being upgraded from the erstwhile Bajali College and on assumption of the Office of Vice Chancellor by Prof. Birinchi Kumar Das on the very same day. Bhattadev University was established as per an Act of the State Legislature – Bhattadev University Act, 2017 following the assent of the Governor of Assam to it on 16 October, 2017. The erstwhile Bajali College had enjoyed a glorious past in the history of academia of the State. It could well carve out for itself a name in imparting quality higher education to the students of the greater Bajali area and beyond. The College was established in 1955 thereby resulting in successful completion of the realisation of a long cherished dream of the people of greater Bajali region. It was on account of the untiring efforts and selfless devotion of the people of the greater Bajali that the college was able to see the light of the day and since then the college had been making great strides in the direction of imparting quality higher education to the students. As a token of recognition for such a contribution by the college in the field of higher education, Bajali College was accredited with "A" Grade in its 2<sup>nd</sup> cycle of NAAC Assessment in the year 2016. For a period of long six decades, Bajali College, first under the able Principalship of the renowned educationist and Calcutta University Gold Medalist Kameswar Das, had been rendering service in enlightening the minds of the students of this region till its time of upgradation into a university in 2017. Striving hard and as always, Bhattadev University promises to remember always its erstwhile glorious past and to develop itself fully into a university where facilities for imparting and generation of knowledge will take place in the real sense of the term by providing classroom and research facilities to both students and teachers alike in an ample and satisfactory manner.

Bhattadev University has been aptly named after an illustrious son of Assam, Baikunthanath Bhagavat Bhattacharya popularly known as Bhattadev, who is acknowledged as the father of Assamese prose. Bhattadev's scholarship in Sanskrit grammar and literature, and his command over the *Shrimadbhagavata Purana* earned him the title of Bhagavat Bhattacharya.

Promising to hold onto the inclination towards learning and scientific discussion on classical scholarship, Bhattadev University is also making all efforts to include newer echelons of newer learning in the faculties of Arts and Science streams. It is noteworthy to mention that postgraduate courses in Geography and Zoology departments of erstwhile Bajali College were introduced way back in the early 1980s with the postgraduate course in the Department of Geography being the second oldest one in Assam after that of Gauhati University.

In 2019, the year when Bhattadev University came into concrete form, the university introduced postgraduate programme in Physics. Bhattadev University plans to introduce postgraduate programme in Chemistry very soon. As of today, the university runs postgraduate programmes in Mathematics, Assamese, Zoology and Geography, and it will soon start new 2-year postgraduate programmes in Chemistry, Commerce, Economics, English, and Political Science. The Vice Chancellor, Prof. Birinchi Kr. Das, has been taking keen interest in starting Ph.D. research programmes in several subject areas from this academic session onward. Proposal to the Government of Assam requesting for allotment of a considerably larger plot of land to build a second campus of the university has been underway, and the university remains hopeful in that the Government will duly pay heed to this prerequisite of ours in this regard. However, in order to conduct smooth functioning of the regular classes and to carry out research works and programmes, Bhattadev University has been developing and renovating its present infrastructure facilities at its existing campus at Pathsala town. Recruitment of teachers in the position of Assistant Professor, Associate Professor and Professor in various departments of the university has been scheduled to take place and proposals for recruitment in this regard have been duly forwarded to the State Government. Proposals for recruitment into vacant but sanctioned posts meant for recruiting non-teaching staff members of the university have already been forwarded to the authority concerned.



# COVID MANAGEMENT STRATEGIES ADOPTED BY BHATTADEV UNIVERSITY 2020-21

COVID 19 came as a shock to the world at large and like others Bhattadev University, Bajalitoo tried to brace up to combat the epidemic in its own possible ways and by strictly adhering to the Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) issued by the government from time to time. In order to meet the need and the urgency of the hour, the university decided to set up a COVID 19 Task Force and Students' Grievance Redressal Cell for COVID 19, and the university did it accordingly. The university carried out the task of distributing printed pamphlets and leaflets in Assamese and English languages for awareness generation on COVID 19 among the masses. Further, the university, especially at the initiative of the Chemistry Department, undertook the task of preparing hand sanitizers and the same were distributed among the public. The university created a few COVID-19 special webpages on the college website to provide information to the teachers and the students regarding the prevailing health crisis.

In respect of the act of imparting knowledge to the students, the university instructed the teachers to carry on the duty of teaching and evaluating the students through online mode. As the situation was in 'work from home' mode, both the teachers and students took resort to Zoom, Google classrooms for teaching-learning and evaluation process. Formation of WhatsApp groups by the respective teachers of every department of the university went a long way in furthering and sustaining the academic interest of the students. Further, specific queries, concerns and comments regarding the effectiveness of online teaching that the teachers were undertaking could be submitted to the university authority by writing to the email id - feedback.bustudents@gmail.com so that the university could have a direct way of learning from the students about what was going on day-to-day basis. Numerous orders, advisories and guidelines from Government agencies and WHO were published for the purpose of preventing the occurrence and spread of the disease and sometimes aimed at addressing the mental issues faced by the people of all categories. Such information including a collection of articles published by The Hindu Group were also available in the university website. Special message from the Vice Chancellor informing the students and the others about the commencement of examinations, providing succour to the student fraternity were posted at the university website. The students were asked to visit the university website for clearance of doubts and queries related to the holding of classes and examinations by the Vice Chancellor.

Timely evaluation of homework assignments and answer scripts though e-mail correspondence and whatsapp was done by the teachers as per the timely instructions of the university and, therefore, the university could declare the results of the students without much further delay.

Regular sanitization of the classrooms and the compulsory use of mask by both the students and teachers within the university campus were ensured by the university. Social distancing between individuals within the university campus was also ensured and maintained by Bhattadev University. Resumption of classes, however, took place towards the last of the academic session in a restricted manner as per the SOP issued by the government to this effect.



#### MESSAGE TO THE STUDENTS FROM THE VICE-CHANCELLOR

As many of you will remember, I had written to you last year in the beginning phases of the COVID-19 pandemic when it had started to shake humanity to the core with its virulence. We have lived for more than a year under the dark clouds of SARS-CoV-2 virus and efforts to contain the disease are on in almost all parts of the globe. I shall not be elaborating on the measures being taken by our nation and our state in this direction, but shall simply say that one can remain free from the disease (i) by staying physically distant from others, (ii) by invariably wearing a good facemask correctly in public spaces, and (iii) by intelligently following the widely publicized COVID-appropriate behavior including the maintenance of healthy hand hygiene. I fondly hope that you all are following the above good practices to defeat the disease collectively.

Since it is hard to tell whether there can be offline (face-to-face) teaching for the current second and fourth semester UG classes, students of these two semesters will do well to take online learning (and also self-learning) seriously even during the period of summer vacation which has been scheduled early to spare the month of July for your on-campus learning, if possible. We are also trying to think about holding your semester-end examinations in the month of August, if feasible. Moreover, it is being hoped that we shall also be able to start virtual teaching for the UG sixth semester students immediately after they complete their fifth semester examination under GU.

We are making efforts to hold the semester-end examinations of the first and third semester PG students in the second half of June positively and in all likelihood these examinations will be held in the online mode. We shall make the details known to you by May 31st. So, prepare well for the examinations by giving greater importance to studying directly from text and reference books suggested by your teachers.

Furthermore, now that the students of 1st Year HS classes have been promoted to the 2nd Year, we shall undertake efforts to start online classes of the 2nd Year HS students as well. Keep visiting our website regularly for updates and prepare your mind for attending classes even if they are started during the summer vacation.

Now that vaccines against COVID-19 are available, we may be able to see an end to our miseries in about a year from now. Till then, continue behaving intelligently and responsibly, live healthily and hope for a bright future; Mother Nature will prepare you to cope successfully with this and all other trying situations.

Following the declaration of COVID-19 (COronaVIrus Disease of 2019) as a pandemic by World Health Organisation (WHO) on 11 March 2020, the Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi had declared the first lockdown of the country on 25 March and we entered a never-experienced phase of life. Since the disease itself is caused by infection due to novel coronavirus, scientifically christened SARS-CoV-2 by WHO, the human body is finding it very hard to fight against this unprecedented disease. #### **CENTRAL FACILITIES** Library and Information Centre, Bhattadev University

The Library and Information Centre of Bhattadev University was established in the year 1955 while being a part of the erstwhile Bajali College. The library caters to the needs of the students, teachers and research scholars belonging to the different departments of the university. It has been able to serve the basic academic requirements as felt by the student and teaching fraternity of the university by being well-equipped with the necessary number and kind of books, journals, magazines, newspapers and e-resources. The library avails the opportunity to purchase books and other allied facilities to meet the ever growing interest of the students and the research scholars engaged in different fields of academic interest. Students in considerable number visit the library, and the library has a seating capacity for 100 numbers of students to sit at a time. The stock of books in the Library and Information Centre, Bhattadev University has been significantly increased and improved upon of late, and it has a tie-up with INFLIBNET. Library Automation work facility is available here and there is provision of internet facility for both students and teachers. The library is also equipped with photostat facility. It is well furnished with ICT facility like OPAC, Yes, Soul 2.0 library software together with NLIS facility. Students and teachers can have easy access to eresources and they could also download and print the same. A full time Librarian is in charge of the Library and Information Centre of Bhattadev University. Other than him, the library has a staff strength of 1 (one) Assistant Librarian and 2 (two) Library Bearers. Very soon, 2 (two) vacant posts of Library Assistant and 2 (two) vacant posts of Library Bearer are going to be filled up.

Bhattadev University Press was established in the year 2016 and Mr. Apurba Talukdar is the Teacher-in-Charge of the Press. The Press is equipped with a Swift 300 Gold Offset Printing Machine with Double Master facility, perforation and half label cutting machine, stitching machine, etc. All publications and printing works related to Bhattadev University are carried out by the press. Documents and books pertaining to the various departments of the university are published by the press. It also undertakes the task of printing the university prospectus, academic books, journals, writing pads, answer scripts for all examinations conducted by the university, copies for service books of the employees of the university, registers required for different official purposes and other related materials required for university purpose from time to time.

#### **Institutional Biotech HUB**

#### Phase-I:

Hands on training on plant tissue culture and its optimization strategies; workshop on Biotechnology and its avenue to research were conducted for PG and undergraduate students. A total of 10 PG and undergraduate dissertations and academic projects were conducted under the Biotech HUB scheme at the university. Invited lectures and seminars on awareness of the prospects of Biotechnology were held. A total of five (5) research articles were published in college and national journals under the Biotech HUB fund. The SEs/UCs of the fund for the Biotech HUB were diligently submitted successfully.

#### Phase-II

Having performed the Phase I of the Biotech HUB satisfactorily, the HUB was able to secure a fund amounting to ₹ 31, 55,200.00 for the Phase-II. The Institutional Biotech HUB aims to conduct hands on training and invited lectures on Molecular Biology techniques and Bioinformatics to bring awareness on applications of Biotechnology for students. It also targets to encourage entrepreneurship to unemployed youths by conducting workshops on Bee keeping, integrated farming and vermicomposting. The HUB will undertake research in line to Investigation on Biofertilizers to Promote Safe and Sustainable Crop Production; besides conducting PG and undergraduate academic dissertations and projects of students.


### **Hostel Facilities**

## A REPORT ON ACTIVITIES CONDUCTED BY OFFICE OF THE DIRECTOR OF STUDENT WELFARE

#### Activities of NCC

As per instruction from the NCC office, an awareness program regarding "Mega Pollution" was organised by the 60 Assam Girls' Bn, NCC and 7 Assam Bn., Bhattadev University, Bajali wing on 12..03.2020. A total number of 20 cadets of the Bhattadev University wing participated in the entire programme. The programme was started with a cleanliness drive in the Bhattadev University premises to make aware the students as well as teachers to keep the campus clean, followed by a tree plantations program to make the campus green. Then a rally was preceded towards daily bazar, Pathsala showing various play cards on pollution awareness and measures to control pollution.
