- Volunteering can be project-based, short-term, or long-term, depending on student availability.

2. Student-Led Community Projects

- Students will take up individual projects or participate in department-assigned group projects based on their locality.
- Projects may include:
 - Teaching underprivileged children.
 - Organizing environmental conservation initiatives.
 - Conducting health awareness and sanitation campaigns.
 - Providing digital literacy and skill training in rural areas.
 - Assisting with disaster relief and rehabilitation efforts.
- They must inform their mentor and department coordinator, secure approval, and submit an action plan.
- Regular reporting, journaling, and evaluation criteria remain the same.
- No funding will be provided; students must utilize available community resources and establish local partnerships if necessary.

3. Course-Integrated Community Work

- Faculty members integrate community engagement into coursework through structured assignments and projects.
- Students apply theoretical knowledge to design and implement community-based solutions.
- Faculty supervisors oversee student participation and evaluate project outcomes based on impact and innovation.
